OSHA has concluded that effective management of worker safety and health protection is a decisive factor in reducing the extent and severity of work-related injuries and illnesses. Effective management addresses all work-related hazards, including those potential hazards that could result from a change in worksite conditions or practices. It addresses hazards whether or not they are regulated by government standards.

OSHA urges all employers to meet the safety and health program management guidelines in a manner that addresses the specific operations and conditions of their worksites.
